I used the context hint worksheets on this page to help my students in the classroom. I share them with you in the hope that they will also help you. The words were selected from the texts recommended by Common Core. These context hint worksheets have been divided into three levels: these are the simplest context hint worksheets. These worksheets are designed to help struggling students in lower grades. They were written to help students read in 3rd to 6th grade. Make sure you preview all materials before using them in your classroom. Context Clues worksheet 1.1 This Level 1 context information worksheet contains 12 words that can be challenging for beginners. Students determine the meaning of each word based on context, and then explain their answers. Context-Clues worksheet 1.2 This level 1 context has a worksheet with 12 other contextual clues that have problems for students with reading skills. Context Clues worksheet 1.3 Here are twelve other level one vocabulary words used in context-rich sentences. Students determine the meaning of the word by using it and explain its answers. Context Clues Worksheet 1.4 Here's another double-sided contextual hint worksheet. It still has twelve level one vocabulary. Remember, level one is the easiest. Check Level 2 or 3 if this worksheet is too simple. Context Clues worksheet 1.5 Here's another double-sided worksheet that gives students more practice with contextual clues. It has twelve Level 1 vocabulary words. Students define the word based on how it was used in a sentence, and then explain their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 1.6 Here's another context hint worksheet that helps students master these basic reading skills. This worksheet has 12 Level 1 vocabulary words. Students determine the the bold-formatted word in each sentence based on the context. Then they will explain their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 1.7 This is the seventh-level contextual hint worksheet. If you or your students can accomplish this task, it may be time to move to level two. This worksheet contains another 12 vocabulary words. Students read the sentences and find out what the bold word means based on context. Then they explain their answers. Level 2 These worksheets have been designed for students with Reading and vocabulary skills. They are written for students reading in 5th to 8th grade. Context Clues Worksheet 2.1 Here is the first-level worksheet of two content hints. Level 2 worksheets contain vocabulary and use set structures that are more difficult than Level 1 contextual clues. This worksheet contains 12 tricky vocabulary words used in context-rich sentences. Students find out the meaning of each word based on usage, then explain their answers. Context Clues worksheet 2.2 Here are twelve still moderately difficult problems. Students read each sentence and determine the meaning of the bold vocabulary words using cross-sentence hints. Context Clues Worksheet 2.3 Here's another Level 2 contexthint worksheet. It contains twelve problems with contextual sentences. Students use the cross-sentence notes to determine the meaning of the bold word and explain their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 2.4 Here's another double-sided contextual hint worksheet. It still has twelve level one vocabulary. Remember, level one is the easiest. Check Level 2 or 3 if this worksheet is too simple. Context Clues Worksheet 2.5 Here's another Level 2 contextual hint worksheet. It has twelve problems to help you or your students master this essential reading skill. Read the problems. Find out what the bold vocabulary means based on the context of the sentence, and then explain. Context Clues Worksheet 2.6 This is the sixth contextual hint worksheet in Level 2. As with the other contextual worksheets, it is double-sided and contains twelve problems. Students determine the meaning of the bold-formatted word in each sentence based on the context. Then they will explain their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 2.7 Here is the last Level 2 contexthint worksheet. If you or your students can complete them, it may be time to move to level three. This worksheet is double-sided and contains twelve problems. Students read the sentences and find out what the bold word means based on context. Then they explain their answers. Level 3 These are the most difficult contextual hints worksheets. These are designed for students with reading and vocabulary skills. These worksheets may be suitable for students reading in 8th to 12th grade. Context Clues Worksheet 3.1 Here is the first content hint worksheet of the level three. This worksheet contains twelve challenging issues where students can determine the meaning of the bold word based on the context of the sentence. Students also show higher thinking skills by explaining their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 3.2 Here is another level three. This worksheet contains twelve more difficult problems where students use cross-sentence hints to determine the meaning of unknown vocabulary words. Then they explain their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 3.3 Here is another layer three contexthints worksheet. It has 12 12 Vocabulary words in contextual sentences. Students determine the meaning of bold vocabulary based on the context of each sentence. Then they will explain their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 3.4 Here's another Level 3 contexthint worksheet. The third highest vocabulary sheets are the most demanding. This worksheet contains 12 more sophisticated vocabulary words used in context-rich sentences. Students identify the meaning of the bold vocabulary using the crosssentence notes and explain their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 3.5 Just in case you don't have enough practice with contextual clues, here's another double-sided worksheet. There are some real head scratches on this, but the context rich sentences will help you determine the meaning of the bold words. Context Clues Worksheet 3.6 Here is the first content hint worksheet of the level three. This worksheet contains twelve challenging issues where students can determine the meaning of the bold word based on the context of the sentence. Students also show higher thinking skills by explaining their answers. Context Clues Worksheet 3.7 This is the seventh-level contextual hint worksheet. Students who complete this correctly have the ability to use contextual clues to determine the meaning of unknown vocabulary words. You should probably start assigning some other reading to them. This worksheet has twelve challenging problems. Students find out the meaning of the bold word based on the context of the sentence. They also explain their answers. What are contextual hints? Contextual hints are hints in the sentence that help good readers figure out the meaning of devalued words. When we look at the context of a word, we look at how it is used. Based on the use of these words and our knowledge of the other words in the sentence, we make an educated prediction of what the challenging vocabulary can mean. Example of using context clues Examine this line from Lewis Carroll's poem Jabberwocky: The frumious Bandersnatch! Although neither frumious nor bandersnatch were words before Carroll coined them, readers are able to get a sense of the construction based on the way the words are used. Reading the entire poem is a helpful way to introduce contextual clues to your students. Context Clues Climber Watch this free vocabulary video game.
